

Treasurer Report, November 30 Financials

The financial performance of the Church improved in November, and this was a good month. A better November performance helped offset accumulated deficits for the year in the General Fund (GF), but reserves were still required to fund operations for the 11 months of 2022. Total donations for both funds through November increased approximately \$5,000 to \$174,404 from the same point last year. The improvement in donations was a welcome sign given rising costs experienced this year

GF contributions in November were \$16,182 compared to \$8,420 last month. Several large donations were received helping bolster GF receipts. Expenses for the month were \$13,816. There were no significant expenses that were unexpected, and expense centered on personnel, utilities, and building upkeep as noted in past reports. November expenses did include moving expenses for the Preacher of \$1,821 which are nonrecurring one-time charges. GF contributions for the year totaled \$131,013, and the accumulated deficit declined approximately \$3,000 to \$7,156 because of November operations.

Building Fund (BF) contributions totaled \$4,155 in November with the mortgage payment of \$4,680 as the primary cash expense. Despite improved BF donations this month, a net cash loss of \$536 was realized. The cumulative net cash loss for the year was \$6,875. The mortgage balance on November 30 was approximately \$431,514. Cash reserves in the BF are sufficient to cover 10 mortgage payments while the unofficial goal is at least 12 in case the Church incurs an unexpected situation where operations slow or stop for a period.

Outreach and Committee activity was moderate in November. Outreach funds received were \$1,540, and \$1,650 was remitted. Outreach year to date totaled \$19,683, and the four largest ministries were Elf & Wee Care Baskets, Good Samaritan, Week of Compassion, and Disciples Women Blankets.
